Treasurer – 2-year term (2019-2020)

4. Arrange for preparation and filing of all required tax returns.
5. Preparation of an annual financial report.
6. Preparation of monthly financial report and present it to the Central Office Board and COR General Committee.
7. Attend Central Office Board and General Committee meetings.
8. Shall have at least five years' continuous sobriety at the time of taking office.
